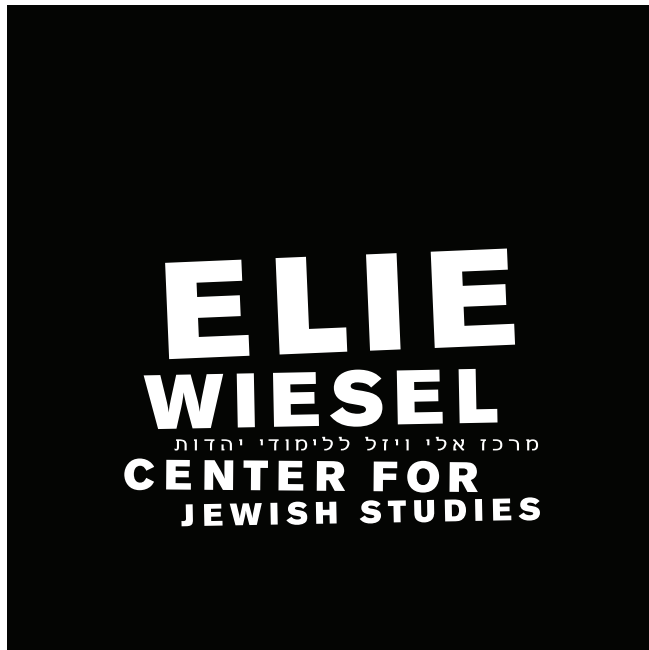

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Brandeis Grad Students Make Social Impact with JewBer, "Bring Jewish Experiences to Your Front Door"

Hornstein second-year MA/MBA graduate students, Ana Sazonov, Simon Luxemburg, and Myla Green, didn't wait to complete their program at Hornstein to start their own nonprofit. When the pandemic hit in March, they saw an immediate need in the Boston-area Jewish community: many Jewish health care professionals and other front-line workers were putting in long hours and did not have access to a kosher Passover meal. Drawing on knowledge, skills, and support they gained through the Hornstein Program's dual-degree MA in Jewish Professional Leadership and Social Impact MBA from The Heller School, and rallying community partners and volunteers, they delivered more than 150 Passover meals to tired and hungry healthcare professionals—JewBer was launched!

One year and 2,000 meals later, JewBer has expanded its mission to include low-income seniors and Holocaust survivors. Says Sazonov, "Our Hornstein-Heller education—from the knowledge and skills we've gained in the classroom and in the field, to the mentoring support from faculty, to the amazing generosity and creative ingenuity of our committed team—has helped us make this dream a reality!"

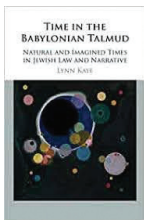

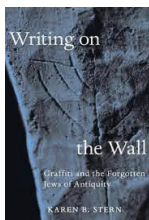

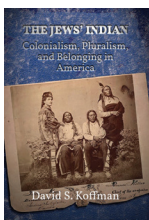
